



BELGO-BRITISH CONFERENCE 2013 – COMMUNICATIONS REPORT "HISTORY AND RECONCILIATION: ENGAGING A NEW GENERATION"



HEADLINE COMMS:

Belgian Foreign Minister Didier Reynders and UK Minister for Europe David Lidington gave media interviews in Lancaster House, with mentions of the Belgo-British Conference and comments on the First World War Centenary carried in news outlets reaching an audience of <u>over 1 million readers</u>. On digital engagement, in the week of the Conference, UK Foreign Secretary William Hague and Belgian Foreign Minister Didier Reynders tweeted to each other for congratulations on the UK-Belgium shared Nobel Physics Prize. Tweets about the Conference by the Embassy @UKinBelgium, @BelgiumMFA, @be_British (Council), UK Minister for Europe, Belgian Foreign Minister, and PM's Special Rep on First World War Commemorations and #BelgoBrit participants reached external audiences of <u>over 60,000 Twitter followers</u>. The Conference was also highlighted on the British and Belgian Embassy facebook pages, as well as on the UK Government website.

- Ahead of bilateral meeting, UK Foreign Secretary @WilliamJHague tweeted to Belgian Foreign Minister @DReynders to congratulate on Nobel Physics Prize for the UK's Peter Higgs and Belgium's François Englert;
